Children Activities for Easter

There are 3 sets of activities.

Choose the set that is most appropriate for your child.

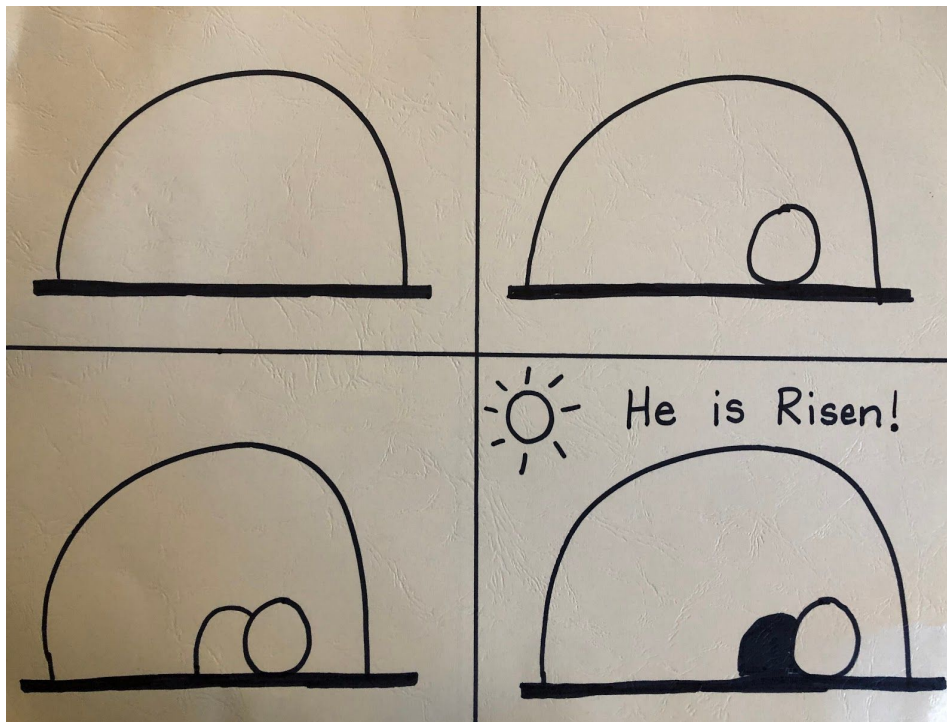
No matter what set your child uses, you are encouraged to talk with them about the activity and learn along with them.

May God give you even greater Easter joy through these learning activities!

SET 1 (best for 6 and under)

Help your child follow these 4 steps to draw the empty tomb.

Add color and display as an Easter decoration.



SET 2 (best for age 6-10)

Take turns reading the verses with your child and then ask your child the question.

- Read Matthew 27:50. What does it mean that Jesus gave up his Spirit? **The time had come for Jesus to die, so he let his body die.**
Draw a cross.
- Read Matthew 27:59. What did Joseph do after Jesus died? **Joseph put Jesus' body into a tomb.**
Draw a picture of Joseph carrying Jesus to the tomb.
- Early on Easter morning some women came to visit the tomb of Jesus. Read Matthew 28:1, 5-6. What did the angel tell the women about Jesus? **He had risen from the dead!**
Draw an angel.
- Read Matthew 16:21. What had Jesus told the disciples would happen on the third day? **He would be raised to life.**
Write out 1,2,3 and draw the sun around 3.
- Ask your child to tell you what belongs in the blank:
Jesus always keeps his_____
promises
- To hear another wonderful promise from Jesus read John 11:25. What is the promise of Jesus? **Whoever believes in Jesus will live forever.**
Draw yourself with a big smile.
- Where will believers in Jesus live forever? **Heaven**
Write out the word heaven in your best writing and in your favorite color.



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Children Activities for Easter

Set 3 (best for age 10+)

Option 1

- Imagine you are the disciple Thomas.
- Read John 20:24-29 to review what happened with you after Jesus' resurrection.
- Make a video message to share with the world about your experience that will encourage people to believe that Jesus is alive.

Option 2

Make a scavenger hunt for people in your family. Use these Easter related items. Get creative. What you don't have on hand, make.

stone - cross - sponge - angel - burial cloth - nails - spear - dice - Bible

Option 3

Write an acrostic poem using the word Easter. Your poem should have 6 sentences each beginning with a letter from the word Easter. Your sentences should reflect how Christians view Easter. No easter bunnies :)
