Psalm 78:1-7

A maskil of Asaph.

The 78th psalm is a psalm of instruction. Using the example and history of the entire people of Israel from the beginning until David, it teaches us to trust and to believe in God, and it warns us against mistrust and faithlessness. The psalm declares the punishment that follows and the grace that comes with trust.*



- ¹ O my people, hear my teaching; listen to the words of my mouth.
- ² I will open my mouth in parables, I will utter hidden things, things from of old—
- ³ what we have heard and known, what our fathers have told us.
- ⁴ We will not hide them from their children;

we will tell the next generation the praiseworthy deeds of the LORD, his power, and the wonders he has done.

- ⁵ He decreed statutes for Jacob and established the law in Israel, which he commanded our forefathers to teach their children,
- ⁶ so the next generation would know them,

even the children yet to be born, and they in turn would tell their children.

⁷ Then they would put their trust in God and would not forget his deeds but would keep his commands.

Paul instructed, "Let a person examine himself and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup" 1 Co 11:28. Questions like these help us examine ourselves:

- Am I sorry for my sin?
- Do I trust that Jesus has lived and died to save me from my sin?
- Do I believe that Jesus' body and blood are truly present to assure me of forgiveness?
- Do I intend, with God's help, to live a more God-pleasing life?
